



FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA) RELEASE FORM

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a Federal Law that protects the privacy of student education records, both financial and academic. For the student's protection, FERPA limits release of student record information without the student's explicit written consent; however it also gives the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) the right to review those records if the parent(s)/guardian(s) claim the student as a dependent on their Federal Income Tax Return.

This form must be completed and returned with a signed copy of your 2007 Federal Income Tax Return to certify that the student is your dependent according to Section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code. This verification is only valid for the current academic year through the spring semester. Since IRS dependency can change annually, you must submit copies of your Federal Income Tax Return each year along with this form to continue to access your student's records.
